

### Wolves in Wolves trail – A Council co-ordinated art sculpture trail, funded by sponsors



City of Wolverhampton is set to be gripped by wolf fever next week as the 'Wolves in Wolves' trail kicks-off.

All 30 wolves will be in place at different locations across the city centre from Wednesday, July 5, with maps now available to help people hunt them down.

City of Wolverhampton Council Cabinet Member for City Economy, Councillor John Reynolds, said: "The artists have produced outstanding designs that really catch the eye.

"Wolves in Wolves is a great opportunity to showcase the city to visitors and I'm sure these 30 wolves will help put the city on the map as a cultural centre.

"It is also a fun way for families to get active and discover the city and what it has to offer."
