
Do you think there were a variety of activities and stalls?


If no, what other activities/ stalls would you like to see?

I would have liked to see more stalls selling hand-crafted goods, particularly from the local schools to help them raise funds - Christmas decorations etc. The stalls/crafters situated under the town hall gave the best variety, albeit some of these were familiar ones from the regular Sunday craft market. I would have liked to have seen a choir/carols in the Central Court area, like last year. It seemed rather bare and lacking in atmosphere. The choir who performed there last year were not asked till quite late in the planning if they could do this again, and consequently did not have availability. Central Court itself was not, I felt, well-signposted in terms of letting visitors to the town know that there were more shops to explore. I was asked myself "is there anything down there?" as I came back up to the High St. In other considerations, please feed a loudspeaker for the 'countdown' to the switch-on down to the bottom (Cartway) end of the High St. It was impossible for anyone past the town hall to know what was happening on the stage by the Northgate, or to join in with the countdown. The lights just seemed to randomly come on without any build-up, making those of us in that half of the street feel excluded from the 'countdown' aspect.
- More fair ground rides less alcohol as your taking it from the pubs Unfortunately Brosley out Bridgnorth to Shame
- More independent businesses to buy gifts not just food stalls.
- Toilets should be open for people to use

- More local stall holders and not 8 different cake stands.


Do you think the duration of the event 4pm-8pm is suitable?








- Signage




- Only thing I didn't understand was the first place we were sent to wait and then moved to the High Street, I felt it was to far away

I myself being a larger unit needed to be allowed earlier than number 3 and easier to be on the other side of the street just to drive in and set instead of having to turn around in a packed street.


Always a pain to get back into the High Street, people in lower high could be allowed to use the other road in not sure of name.




